Where did the summer go? For starters, we had over a month of rain and then came scorching heat, so outside activities were at times too strenuous and exhausting. Still, what a wonderful summer season it was here at church!



A big thank you goes to our master gardeners who on the Church Garden Tour invited us into their colorful floral outdoor living spaces and even wined and dined us.

Thank you also to our sixteen teachers who tutored the children from Purdy Elementary School in our new Summer Scholars Program. A big kudos goes to Laurie Riley for organizing this effort, to Thom Outman, our superintendent, and to the Lion's Club for making available scholarships. Plans are underway for next year to expand our outreach and more scholarships will be available to families in need.

Finally, I am grateful to the Stults family for hosting our annual pig roast and to Marshall Hlatko for providing the meat.

The fall season offers further opportunities for fellowship, learning, and giving. I want to highlight a few:

-On **Sunday, Sept. 8**, we are starting a three-week New Member Class, called "Refreshing Our Faith." The class will provide an overview of the central doctrines of the Christian faith, including Reformed worship, the sacraments, and a history of the church. This class is open to any member and will meet in the sanctuary after worship.



- -On **Sunday, Sept. 29** we will kick off our Stewardship Campaign. After worship during the Adult Education hour, we will have as our guest speaker Stacey Lott, a lawyer who specializes in estate planning. Stacey will provide us with information on how to have a will drawn up or a trust set up, along with how to include the church in our estate planning.
- -That same day, we will gather by 1:30 p.m. at the First United Methodist Church to work the Crop Walk.

-After Labor Day, we welcome back yoga teacher, Amanda Wallace. Her four-week yoga sessions will start on **Monday, Sept. 9** and meet again at 9 a.m. in the Music Room at church. The cost is \$8 per session or \$28 for all four.

Sept. 22—Polity and Structure of the Presbyterian Church and Spiritual Gifts



The Spirit of God has been reawakened in our church. And we as members and friends continue to build up one another in Christ so that we will shine and be a witness to Christ's powers in the world.

This year's stewardship theme is "Building Up the Body of Christ." It is based on the Apostle Paul's letter to the Ephesians where we are encouraged to enlarge God's kingdom on earth (Eph. 2:21-22). In doing so, we are building upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Jesus Christ as our cornerstone.



We have accomplished much during this past year. Many new ministries were begun, such as the Garden Show and Sale, the Garden Tour, the pastor's weekly lectionary study group, a new member class and refresher course of the Christian Faith, ecumenical worship services during Lent, the new music endowment fund, the hiring of a cantor, solo performances and drama in worship, the summer tutoring program with elementary school children from Purdy, expansive landscaping upgrades, installation of the big electronic church sign, a new driveway and the sealing of our parking lot, opening our doors to homeschooled children and their families, and many new volunteer opportunities.




The Hannah Circle to start on Tuesday, Sept. 17
