#### Dear Friends,

At a recent pastors' retreat sponsored by our Presbytery, we went around the room introducing ourselves. Of the thirty or so participants, about half of us introduced themselves as "transitional pastor" of such and such church. Why not use the term "Interim Pastor" as in our Book of Order? Why call ourselves a "transitional pastor" when what we are doing is filling in for the "interim"?

The short answer is that a lot has changed in our culture and churches. Worship attendance has plummeted drastically in the past two decades, as has church membership, finances, and people's interest in being part of and active in a church.

In the olden days, churches called an interim pastor to be a place holder until the "real pastor" got here. In the olden days, churches expected an interim pastor to make a few tweaks to the structure, proceedings, or organization of a church so the new pastor wouldn't have to deal with the tedious, the troubling, the distasteful entanglements of the past. In the olden days, the interim pastor might also expose some underlying or simmering issues and attempt a quick fix and then leave. But those were the olden days.

I certainly have seen that and more. Over the past thirty years, I have served five interim positions (including Pennfield Church), and three more churches who were looking for a pastor. And I was chair on the Committee



on Ministry overseeing all interim and temporary contracts for six years. All of that is to say that I have been doing and breathing interim ministry for the larger part of my pastoral life.

So what I want you to know is this: First, the number of churches in transition is increasing, in fact has more or less doubled in the last twenty years. Second, the old model of "interim" pastor as place holder has been superseded by that of "transitional pastor."

The transitional pastor prepares the church not so much for the next "real" pastor, even though we transitional pastors are "real" and "ordained" pastors, as for the next stage in ministry. Our job is to help you envision and do ministry in the twenty-first century because a lot has changed. It's to help facilitate the transition of "how we have always done it" to "how

we might do it." It's to look at our surrounding culture and ask the question, "What do people need?" instead of asking, "What do we need or want?"

This past year we have been doing just that. We have looked around us and seen that there are schools with children nearby who need tutoring. There are people living on the brink of poverty who we have invited in and who have become members of our church. There are people who have not sat in an adult Sunday school or

Bible class since their youth and they are now playing catch up. There are people who can't stand committee work but will volunteer and pitch in if asked and we welcome them. And there are those who don't want to join but still play an active role in serving and giving financially to our church. Do you see the shift?

Every Sunday I hear about how excited you are about the new spirit in our church. Yes, we are in transition and I'm privileged to serve as your "transitional pastor" as together we move into a new stage of ministry, a new stage of exploring where the Spirit of our Lord will lead at such a time as this.
