Dear Friends,

The pandemic continues to rage in the United States and we are quarantined still. When will we be shaking hands again, hugging, and mingling in crowds? When will we be stopped from watching reruns of old movies, arrange and re-arrange closets and drawers, calling friends and church members so many times that they declare us crazy!

Quarantined! What is the meaning of that word anyway? The Latin root of the word "quarantine" means "forty." In the fourteenth century, ships arriving in Venice from areas struck with the Black Death (bubonic plague) were required to anchor away from port for 40 days before docking. The Italians called it "quaranta giorni," or "40 days," which evolved into "quarantino." The 40-day quarantine was so effective that it became standard practice in Europe for the next 600 years.

The Bible makes frequent mention of the number 40. The flood lasted forty days, after forty years Moses fled Egypt, Moses stayed on Mount Sinai for forty days. The Exodus lasted forty years. Jesus fasted for forty days. And the season of Lent lasts for forty days. Some biblical scholars hold that the number 40 means change. It is a time of preparing a person or a people for a fundamental change.

Change is certainly happening outside--trees, flowers, shrubs are greening, flowering, producing buds. The Canada geese in my yard already had their goslings and they rush along the pond like little dervishes. I wonder what is

changing in me. Am I giving the Lord more time, more credit, more glory? Am I reading more and studying his word? Am I allowing whatever is good, whatever is true, whatever is beautiful to enter into my mind and heart?

Christ promises us that everything works together for the good of those who love God (Rom. 8:28).

So let us love and serve the Lord with prayer and thanksgiving through small acts of kindness. With love and joy during this 50-day Easter season,

Create a Giving Profile

This will connect you with our Church's Giving Page.

Enter either credit card no. or bank routing number and account number.

You can decide whether to set up repeated giving (monthly or weekly) or make a one-time donation.

You have the option of giving to the General Fund, which supports our annual budget, or to the Capital Fund, which supports individual building projects or capital improvements.

We already have received several donations in this manner and are grateful to you for doing so.

The percentage we pay for each transaction is small, so please do as is most convenient, that is, either give by mailing in your pledge envelope or donation, or by giving online.


A Big Thank You to Our Livestreaming Worship Team


PW Birthday Offering
