Dear Friends,

Last month, we received the recommendation from our Presbytery to postpone re-opening the church for inperson worship until January 2021. On Aug. 30, the Session met to discuss this proposal. The consensus was that we might aim for opening the church on Nov. 29, which is the first Sunday in Advent, so as to celebrate Advent and Christmas services in person.

This date is tentative and much will depend on the number of Covid-19 cases reported in our county. If the numbers are favorable, we will follow strict safety precautions.

- 1. All in attendance will need to wear a mask and keep at least 6 feet of distance. (The seats in the pews will be marked to indicate where to sit.) Seating will be toward the back.
- 2. There will be no social gatherings in the narthex either before or after worship.
- 3. The sanctuary and narthex capacity combined cannot exceed 30 people, which may mean that reservations need to be made by phone or email the week prior.
- 4. There will be no access to Fellowship Hall or the lower level.

Please know that Session is concerned for the safety of our members and hopes that you understand that these measures are intended to protect you, the ones we love.

Regardless of when we re-open for in-person worship, we hope you will continue to join us regularly for live-streamed worship on Sundays via facebook and for adult education classes via Zoom.

A New Sound System

For the last couple of months, the Session has been receiving bids to replace our sound system. The current system is from the 1980s. It runs in analog mode and requires numerous buttons for adjustment and finetuning. The new system will be digital and operated from a laptop in the sanctuary. It will include both sound and video (with two cameras) that are linked to our livestream. The new system will give us greater flexibility with our livestreamed worship services and enhance the overall quality of our sound on video and in person.



Our old system will be donated to a foundation that distributes sound equipment to churches in developing countries.

The majority of the cost for the system will come from memorial funds. If you would like to contribute, you may do so by marking your check "Sound System" on the memo line.

Adult Education Classes on Sundays


Contemporary Issues Class

You can decide whether to set up repeated giving (monthly or weekly) or make a one-time donation.

You have the option of giving to the General Fund, which supports our annual budget, or to the Capital Fund, which supports individual building projects or capital improvements, such as the Sound System.

Livestreamed Worship at 10 a.m.

Here are a few more tips on how to tune into our live worship service.

Go to the facebook page of Annemarie Kidder shortly before 10 a.m. When the live broadcast is on, you will see a notification in the "bell" icon either in the upper right corner or the lower left corner. This "bell" icon will have a red dot now. Click on the bell (which is really the notification icon) and you will see a message saying "Annemarie Kidder is live." Click on that message and the video will appear.

Please note that while the video is on, you are in a virtual community. That means you can interact with other viewers, such as greeting them or clicking "like" on their comments. Also note that the video will stay up, so you can go back later if you missed watching or you can watch it again. You can also comment on the video later on. The worship video will also be posted on our church's facebook page, where it will stay up also. Each Sunday, Lois Shubert, our tech coordinator, records the special music separately on her facebook page.

You can share the worship video to your own facebook page after the broadcast has ended. To do so, simply click the "Share" button beneath the video.

If you would like to prepare for worship ahead of time, you will find a blurb on our church's facebook page every Friday introducing the topic or gist of the upcoming sermon and the preaching text, which tends to be the Gospel from our revised common lectionary.


Hannah Women's Circle
