Property and Finance Committee Update

As of last week, we have heat at the church and the new boiler is up and running. A big thank you to all who so generously donated to our Boiler Fund and made it possible to have a brand new heating system. The current boiler is highly efficient and uses a minimum of energy.

The sound and video system is nearly up and running. The company, Phillips Pro Systems of Temperance, Michigan, is still waiting for one of two cameras by which we will record the live worship service.

Lighting has been considerably improved for video purposes. All ceiling lights have been replaced by LED bulbs. In addition, new track lighting will be installed in the coming days, so that the chancel area is better illumined and shadows are being kept to a minimum. Also, we now have outdoor lighting, which means our church is illuminated at night and shines like a "beacon" on the hill.

Our Church's Labyrinth


