Dear Friends,

We are about half-way through Lent and I wonder how you are doing with your particular Lenten practice. Have you abandoned it altogether or are you limping along with some days going better than others? I know I am not doing as I should.

I had hoped to read a lot more than I have so far, and the books are piling up by my chair unopened and unread. Some of you have shared that you plan on reading the Bible more. As valuable as this proposition is, reading the Bible, sitting with it, and letting the words percolate is not quite that easy.

So, if you want to dig a little deeper with Scripture,



I suggest you pick one Gospel, preferably Matthew, Mark, or Luke, and just read one "scene" a day (since chapters often contain many scenes). By scene I mean one event in the life of Jesus, one action moment, one story, one dialogue and saying. Read it a second time, maybe out loud. And now listen to the particular word or words that might rise to the surface. Hold that word, that phrase, and ask the Lord what he wants to point out to you with it. Then, throughout the day, see if this word or phrase gains more momentum and color and meaning. In the evening, thank the Lord for new insights into his word and purpose for you.

This month we have several opportunities for a little cheer.

On Sunday, March 7 after our Communion worship service at 10 a.m., we will meet virtually via Zoom at 11 a.m. It's a time to have fellowship and conversation and catch up with one another. There will be no 11 a.m. adult education class that day.

On Sunday, March 14, we "spring forward" by one hour for daylight savings time. Don't forget to set your clocks an hour ahead, so you won't be late for live worship.

And on March 28, we celebrate Palm Sunday with a drive-through fellowship time at 11:15 a.m. in our church parking lot. We will have palm branches available for you to pick up and wave and keep throughout the year. In return, we ask that you bring some canned food or dry goods for our Food Pantry.

Northeast Food Pantry News

Meijer is having a first time ever Simply Give winter campaign. This campaign will run from Sunday, February 14 to Saturday, April 10, 2021. There will be two double match

days Saturday, March 13 and Saturday, April 3. On double match days Meijer will contribute an additional \$20 for every \$10 contributed by the public. The cards will be available at the registers at the Meijer on Beckley during the entire winter campaign time. Thanks to everyone who is willing to contribute to make this campaign as successful as the holiday campaign. This is another opportunity to help your neighbors in need. Thanks to everyone who has been collecting and giving the Northeast Pantry your Family Fare receipts. We are working on collecting the last \$40,000 towards \$150,000 worth of receipts. This will be our third set of \$150,000. The pantry receives \$1000 for each set of \$150,000 worth of receipts we turn in. Esther Rayburn has been very gracious in taking on the counting and tallying of these receipts. It is a very time consuming endeavor.

I am also appealing for help in another way. After 19 years of volunteering, John Worthington has retired from pantry work. He had the responsibility of ordering and picking up food from the Food Bank once a week on Monday mornings and delivering and unloading the food at the Northeast Pantry. I am looking for someone who is willing to pick up from the Food Bank and unload at the pantry, perhaps on a rotating basis.
