Dear Friends,

With the extensive rain in recent days, my garden has erupted in a virtual explosion of color. Shades of green in leaves and stems alternate with the pinks and purples and reds of flower petals. But as lush as things are, it also takes ongoing weeding and trimming. Several of you have said that I have a green thumb, though I think the comment is just as fitting that said that I probably have "green knees"--because weeding and trimming requires some kneeling.



It strikes me that kneeling and weeding are related. When we kneel, we pray, and when we pray we "weed out" some of the wild growth. What is the wild growth that invades your spiritual garden? As you pray and focus on God's presence, what type of growth, what kind of weeds are interfering with the inner beauty of peace and hope and joy? Try naming those weeds and calling them out, so they can be uprooted and pulled out.

around the church and in the Memorial Garden. Take a walk along the sloping flowerbeds, the rebuilt patio and pathway, visit the gazebo, the labyrinth, and the picnic area with the fire pit.
