Dear Friends,

We are in the season of Advent. The word "advent" means coming. We wait for the coming of Christ, the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, his birth in our hearts. And maybe we are asking: Why do we celebrate the birth of Jesus again and again? Does he need to be reborn to us and do we need to be reborn again and again? I believe that being human means many good things but it also means that we are supremely forgetful and oblivious. We are oblivious to our own bodies and their needs, to the needs of others, especially the poor and forgotten and easily overlooked, and to the



most obvious needs of friends and family. It's because of such obliviousness, such blatant neglect, that we are in need of redemption, along with regular reminders and wake-up calls. Advent culminates in the birth of Jesus and is an annual wake-up call to the reality that Jesus is God with us, Immanuel, the Savior of nations, of you, of me.

For the **first Sunday in Advent, Nov. 28** we are being treated to a musical special by the family of Gayla Metzger as her grand-children will be singing. On the **second Sunday of Advent, Dec. 5** we celebrate communion. So if you are watching online, please have a piece of bread and some juice ready.

This year's Christmas Eve service is **on Friday, Dec. 24 at 7 p.m.** and will be our traditional candle light service. We are fortunate to have Paula Krontz-Harris leading us musically at the piano, Carla Stine-King will lead us in song, and Josh and Kaylee Tucker will bring the special music on their saxophones.



Due to the rising number of Covid 19 infections in our state of Michigan, we ask that you wear a mask in church. We hope to see you for our Advent worship services and the **Christmas Eve service at 7 p.m.**

"Good morning, I am Lois. I was born into a Presbyterian family. After college we moved to Battle Creek in 1973. We visited Pennfield Presbyterian and stayed. We were welcomed and got involved right away with Youth Fellowship. Did you know Presbyterian Church is one of few churches who have committees that keep the church functioning?

Curiosity got me moving: I have been a deacon and been on every committee in the church. Currently I am on Session, the board of Presbyterian Women, Worship and Music, Fellowship and Evangelism. I also serve as your Worship Coordinator and the chair of Property and Finance.

We found a purpose here at church by learning about Jesus Christ, who offers us eternal life,

and by sharing his message with others so others will know the eternal life in Him. My husband, Mick, and I have been active in stewardship. We have worked consistently in taking care of the church's property and its finances so we could all enjoy God's house. I am particularly pleased that for the past three years we have had a balanced budged, made possible by your generosity.

When COVID 19 hit, many churches were struggling and even closed. We here at Pennfield Presbyterian Church met outdoors first and then began meeting via Zoom.
