Dear Friends,

With the start of this month and Memorial Day we tend to say that summer is here. Soaring temperatures and abundant weeds in garden and lawn are proof. The heat makes us tire more easily and invites a slow-down. As students have graduated and schools are in summer recess, we at church are slowing down a little as well.

The liturgical season that begins this month is the season of Pentecost, lasting until October. It is the season of the Holy Spirit, the power behind all things, the comforter, the advocate, the stabilizing energy that gives us strength and perseverance in our Christian life of faith.



These days we certainly need strength with a healthy helping of hope. So much has changed in just these past few years. After the global pandemic, there is now a war in Europe, growing national drug use and abuse, human trafficking, and financial worries--all threatening our sense of stability and global peace. What used to be true doesn't seem to be any more. The ideals we trusted are laced with cracks. The values we thought enduring are coming apart at the seams. Maybe we are becoming less sure about where we stand--on religious issues, such as the role of women in the church, worship attendance, and financial giving; or on public issues, such as gun control, cannabis use, abortion rights, same-sex marriage, climate change. Maybe we have even gone so far as to reverse our former treasured opinions and moral stance--something we never thought possible before. And now we are wondering what remains stable and which center still holds.

Let's remember especially now what and who our center is. It's not a political party or candidate. It's not a local or national leader or sports team. It's not better jobs, less inflation, stricter laws and police. For us, it's Jesus, also called the Rock. He is and ever should be our center, the central relationship in our lives, the one whose voice we hear and who informs our decisions and actions so that whatever we do for the sake of justice and unity and peace, we do for God--by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Hannah Circle



Northeast Food Pantry News

Things are going well at the pantry. Our numbers are increasing. We are now averaging between 30-40 families weekly. School will be out soon so there will be an even greater need for food because kids will be home for breakfast and lunch during the week.

Thanks to food and monetary donations we are able to keep our shelves stocked in order to meet the needs of our neighborhood. However, we can always use soup, jelly/jam, chips, cookies, crackers (any and all kinds), canned spaghetti sauce, mayo, mustard, ketchup, sugar, flour and toilet paper. Also, keep turning in your Family Fare Direct your Dollar receipts. We must have the whole



receipt; and it must say Direct Your Dollars. We are only about \$6000 away from having another \$150,000 worth of receipts. We will turn these into Spartan Nash (Family Fare) and will get a check for \$1000. This money will be used to purchase shampoo/conditioner, deodorant, toothbrushes/toothpaste, and hand/body lotion. There is great need for these items.

As a reminder, Meijer's spring Simply Give campaign is going on until July 2. The Double Match Day is Saturday, June 18, 2022. Your \$10 donation is matched by Meijer with \$20 for a total of \$30. Northeast's partner store is Meijer on Beckley. Thanks again for all PPC does for the Northeast Pantry neighborhood: food, money, volunteers, Family Fare receipts, Simply Give donations, love and prayers. You are AWESOME.


