Dear Friends,

The recent ice storm turned trees into breath-taking ice sculptures while many people lost power. The severe weather affected our worship schedule also and led to changes.

We will be celebrating a postponed Ash Wednesday service this coming **Sunday**, **March 5** with the **imposition of ashes** and communion. On that day, the men will be meeting for the **Men's Breakfast** at 7 a.m. in Fellowship Hill for breakfast, followed by a study of the sermon text.



Since last week, we have been officially in the season of Lent. The word comes from the Old English word "to lengthen," because our days grow longer. Perhaps you are already knee-deep into a Lenten discipline, such as giving up sweets or adding a form of service and sacrifice to your routines. If you have, the days may indeed feel like they are stretching on and on.

Traditionally, Lent has been a time for Christians of fasting and alms-giving. We do less and we do with less. The result of such simplified living is that we have more time to be resting in the presence of our Lord which, in turn, is bound to heighten our time in prayer.

This year, the Lenten journey will extend to the **adult education hour on Sundays at 11:15 a.m.** We meet in the sanctuary for an immersive Lenten experience, led by Lois Shubert, Trish Steele, and Christine Ayres.

This experience will culminate on **Sunday**, **March 19** with a worship service of new beginnings where we write on a slip of paper a particular attitude or unpleasant habit or behavior we wish to be set free from and then allow the Lord to "burn it away."

I trust that you make Lent a time of prayerful meditation and weekly worship. "You know, Father, how hard it is to be honest to God in prayer," writes the Rev. David Redding, "when I am not that way elsewhere. But I have to begin someplace--why not here in your house?"

# Stewardship Campaign Update

Thank you so much for your 2023 pledge. We have received a great turnout of pledges for the year, but are hoping that we will receive a few more. If you have yet to turn in your pledge card, please do so by mailing it to the church or dropping it in the offering plate. You may also call the church office directly and let our financial secretary, Jean Smith, know how much you plan to give next year.

## **Property and Finance**

After the break of a boiler pipe shortly before Christmas, our boiler engineer has been able to circumvent the ruptured buried pipe by installing new copper pipe that runs into the bathrooms and three smaller classrooms downstairs.

The result of the broken pipe was that there was no heat in the lower level. To prevent debris from entering the costly furnace pump, Shuberts have been attending to the furnace twice a day every day since Dec. 20. They had to monitor the boiler in case it shut off and debris was clogging up the system.



At this time, it appears that the new pipe is working and rooms on the lower level have been heating up. As mentioned before, the old pipe that was buried in the cement floor had to be abandoned and a new pipe was installed that was visible and easily accessible.

The project consisted of three sections. Two of these have been completed, with the third one possibly being completed this week.

We have received a check covering about one third of the actual cost for materials and labor from our insurance company. And we hope that more will be covered.

Again, we want to thank also our cleaners, both those working weekly and those on an as-needed basis. They are doing a terrific job in keeping God's house sparkling clean.




